Dear People of God,

I was recently asked why the Mass seems to end so quickly after Communion. The answer to that is both simple and scriptural (where it gets a little more complicated). Simply put, energized by the Body and Blood of Christ, we're supposed to hit the road and share the good news while it's still fresh in our minds, so there's not to be a long delay between reception of the Body and Blood and our departure to begin the sharing. Scripturally, there are several things going on. Of course, the simplest reference to the Gospels are the commands Jesus gives at the conclusion of the synoptic gospels: go, teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The Eucharist has been given to us as an empowerment to teach. That doesn't mean standing in front of a classroom and offering bible study (although that's one option among many); rather, it means we are to live in the Christ we have received. You'll hear this theme played out over and over later this summer when the Sunday readings include the Feeding of the Five Thousand texts from John's gospel.

The essence of that message is that the Body is the true Body, the Blood the true Blood; we are imbued with the reality of God in Jesus Christ and that should shape the way we think, act, speak and live. On the other hand, because the mystery of the Eucharist brings us to the same Supper Jesus shared with the Disciples on Holy Thursday, we are to follow along with the events of that evening when Jesus shared the cup and then left the Upper Room to begin his passion. We literally get up from the same table and follow Jesus into the world to undertake acts of assistance to those who stand in need, just as we all stand n need of the saving grace of the Cross. This aspect of our quick departure is not so much to teach as it is to serve. Our service is nothing more than the acts of kindness and generosity we can perform on a day-to-day basis until we all meet again to celebrate that same wonderful meal Jesus gives us each time we come to Mass.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


