Dear People of God,

Somebody stopped me after Mass to ask how I manage to find such diverse messages in a text that person had heard preached the same way (not what I preached) for years. I've always enjoyed the Bible and long ago learned to keep my eyes and ears open for "what shouldn't be there." While in graduate school at Stephen F. Austin State University, deep in the Bible Belt, the fraternity to which I belonged attended a different ecclesial community every Sunday (the Southern Baptist was a favorite since they served a spaghetti dinner to all the college students) and we all had to belong to a Bible Study. The one I belonged to passed out little pamphlets every week which we were to go over for discussion the following week. I liked to go beyond the printed material and went back to the actual chapter and verse to find out the context, what came before and what followed and after a week or two I was doing the teaching since nobody else had much of an idea where the week's short text came from. Very often, a key concept is hidden in cultural or theological phrases which don't fit the overall scheme of; at least we don't think they do in our own more techno-savvy environment things so are left out of a Bible Study tract.

You'll hear me point out one of these later this summer when the Feeding of the Five Thousand texts begin over a long, six-week period touching on John's gospel. Ordinarily, those texts are commentary on the Eucharist as the real presence of Jesus; and that's a strong message that needs to be proclaimed regularly (sadly, studies point out that two out of three Catholics who come forward and receive the sacrament do not believe in the real presence). However, there's far more going on in John's text which is focused by a single line John inserts right at the outset before anyone's stomach begins to rumble with hunger pains! That one brief line then permeates everything Jesus has to say to the crowds who enjoyed a couple of loaves and some dried out fish! So, if you'd like to get ahead of the sermon, take a look at John chapter 6 and see if you can find what shouldn't be there (and don't be surprised if you find something I still haven't).

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
