

Dear People of God,

While on the subject of the Rosary, may I share with you some of the history of this amazing prayer device that directly touches on our own diocese? I hope that everyone reading this knows that the diocese was placed under the patronage of Mary, Queen of the Most Holy Rosary by our first bishop, Joseph Schrembs. Notably, our magnificent cathedral includes some truly amazing works of art which depict the Old Testament types of the New Testament mysteries. But there are other works of art which recall the period of time when the Rosary became what all succeeding popes have called it, the most powerful weapon in the Christian's arsenal. Prayer and especially prayer linked to the sacred writings passed down to us from the early Church, puts us in touch with the will of God and we tend to do right, so by using prayer as a weapon, we truly attack the ills of the contemporary world with the power of the World yet to come. So, to the art works in the cathedral and to be specific, knowing that the Rosary was a universally understood and much used prayer, the Church on several occasions proclaimed a Rosary Crusade, a period when everyone was asked to pray the mysteries for a specific reason or intention.

Two of those are memorialized over the side entrances at Queen of the Most Holy Rosary Cathedral and commemorate two amazing and virtually impossible victories over the advancing Turkish forces in the late Renaissance period when the busy-work of forging new nations had more or less depleted the armies of all of those new nations, leaving Europe defenseless. One was on land at Temsvar, modern day Timisoara in Romania, where a small force was able to resist the advances of a much larger Turkish army, preventing the loss of the better part of Eastern Europe. The other is a sea battle at Lepanto when a small Venetian fleet was able to entirely defeat a much larger Turkish fleet and prevent the invasion of central Europe by sea. The popes of the era credited the consistent and sincere prayers of the faithful with saving Europe for Christendom. Much later, the pope who erected our diocese (Pius X) called on the Christians of the world to pray the Rosary for the 'conversion of Russia' after the rise of the communist state. The faith of those who prayed led to a massive under cover Christian movement which, when the USSR collapsed, was ready to step in and carry on the work of Jesus Christ. Take time to learn and pray the Rosary and perhaps you'll experience other miracles in our time!

### **The Celebration of Sacraments**

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
