Dear People of God,

I was asked after Mass not too long ago why there were three Holy, Holy, Holies during that part of the liturgy. The question came with an answer; and the correct one as well: it's to honor and proclaim our faith in the Trinity. The Trinity – one God with three distinct Persons – remains the number one mystery we'll have to wait to discover until we attain the Kingdom and God himself reveals it to us. However, because it's a mystery with no earthly explanation, we do our best to illustrate it with examples ranging from Patrick's shamrock to theological discussions of the disposition of each of the Persons in relating to you and me as Creator, Savior and Sustainer. You can do some serious reflection of your own by reading the Last Supper Discourse in the Gospel of John [Jn 13:31-17:26], where Jesus comes as close as we can find him coming to explaining the Trinity. He certainly emphases the unity between the three Persons, and to some extent gives us some insights into each of them, but there is no "This is the Trinity" text in the gospel.

I suspect Jesus dropped a few hints to spark our curiosity and get us to dive deeper into our faith which is the best way to strengthen our faith! On the other hand, we also do our best to reinforce the unknown reality behind the mystery by creating devices which lead us to think about and embrace the trinity, like those three Holies in the chant. Or the three times we chant Lamb of God before Communion. In the traditional way of using incense this same repletion of three was used to signify the divine Trinity, as at the Offertory when the priest would give three sets of three swings over the sacred offerings, or when the Deacon or Priest would give three sets of three swings over the Word, or when at a funeral the priest would step out in the aisle, look up at the altar and give three sets of three swings - all to intensify our faith in the Trinity. Keep your eyes and ears open and you'll see and hear numerous instances of this same triple repetition in many of our liturgical celebrations.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
