

Dear People of God,

A couple of weeks ago we began reading through a homily delivered in June of 1912. The topic was prayer, and here's the third movement of the sermon. It's a bit brief, so let me add to what Father Chevereaux preached that day and mention that one of the major failures in our prayer is that we don't address them to the Father as Jesus has asked us to do (you may recall earlier this year I wrote a series on the Eucharistic Prayer which is always addressed to the Father). Even beyond that, and it's something Father C. missed, is the outline of prayer provide by Jesus himself and called the Lord's Prayer: *Our **Father**, who art in heaven. . . .* If we followed that template in our petitions perhaps we'd see the answers much more clearly. You can see this even more clearly in John's Gospel where Jesus says several times *Anything you ask the **Father** in my name, he will give you.* At any rate, here's the third movement of the homily:

Now, dear brethren, as to the spiritual favors and blessings, such as the grace of God, the gift of final perseverance, the remission of sins, a happy death, love for God and resignation to his will – there we may ask for absolutely anything and with a firm confidence of obtaining them.

God has promised absolutely to bestow them upon those who ask: *if you, then, being evil, he says, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will our Father from heaven give the good Spirit to them that ask him. Everyone that asketh receiveth.* Look upon God as a kind and prudent Father and be assured he will hear your prayers. Remember, he is faithful and will keep his promise. Nothing is more positive than his promise. He wants to impress this fact upon us so forcibly that he takes an oath that we will receive whatever we ask in (his) Christ's name: *Amen, amen, I say unto you, if you ask the Father anything in my name, he will give it to you. Again, whatsoever you ask the Father in my name that will I do. Ask and you shall receive that your joy may be full.* Need I tell you that Holy Scripture abounds with examples of the efficacy of prayer? You who can read scripture, read what Abraham, Elias and Moses obtained by their prayers. See what St. Peter and St. Paul accomplished. Read ecclesiastical history and the lives of the saints and even in our day you hear of the miraculous cures obtained through prayer so you ought to be surely convinced of the wonderful power and efficacy of prayer.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
