Dear People of God,

Over the past several weeks we've been delving into history. On that same general subject, I might just share with you the venerable tradition of answering questions in a public manner I use in these letters. Way back in 1911, when Bishop Schrembs arrived in Toledo to create a new diocese in Northwest Ohio, there was still a lot of anti-Catholic sentiment (the last KKK cross burning in our area occurred on a Catholic front yard around 1960). The newly consecrated bishop felt that the best way to combat anti-Catholicism in his local church was to 'get out there and find out what others want to know about us'. He put together a team of what would become the familiar faces of the street preachers who wandered from one end of the diocese to the other listening, and then answering questions well into the 1950's. But we're getting ahead of ourselves, so let's go back and say that by 1914 this movement had begun to show some serious results so the Bishop put together the Question Box of the Diocesan Missions for Non-Catholics which saw its first significant neighborhood gathering take place at Liberty Center on 3 May 1914. People of other faiths were invited to come to the Question Box and write down any question they might have. At that first gathering, in an era when Catholics and non-Catholics very seldom worked together, there were 157 questions asked of the Bishop.

As you might imagine, many of them were founded in false truths and legends which circulated about the Church, others had to do with Catholic loyalty to the United States versus Rome, still others focused on some of the raging social issues of the period which Leo XIII had address in his Social Justice encyclical. With a major war about to break out in Europe, there was some concern about where the Church stood on the political issues dividing the European nations. A hundred years after the fact, many of the questions seem funny but reveal the nature of anti-Catholic fervor which some of us old timers will remember was still around in 1960 when a Catholic actually ran for (and won) the Presidency of the United States. Others touch on issues topical in that time period, naming the names of men and women who were happily attacking one another in the media. Quite a few of the same issues continue to be roadblocks in the movement to better understand the various divisions within Christianity. Here's one that might serve as food for thought which touches on two issues in one question: Granting that priests can absolve sins, please explain so that laymen can understand the difference between absolving and forgiving sins. Could you explain the difference for someone who was interested in that topic? Over the next few weeks, I'll tackle some of those century old questions which are still fresh today.

### The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick**: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


