

Dear People of God,

We've been wandering through Northwest Ohio with the **Question Box of the Diocesan Mission for non-Catholics** and I thought we might make a stop at Bowling Green where someone asked: *What is your attitude towards our public schools?* It remains topical today, but back in 1914 when it was asked the Catholic Church in America was governed by the Councils of Baltimore which had mandated that every Catholic parish have a Catholic school. Believe it or not, long after 1914 many public schools were based in a curriculum drawn from Protestant sources and back then there was little love lost between Catholic and Protestant! To assure the spiritual welfare of Catholic boys and girls, parishes were urged to provide Catholic education and that meant, for the most part, Catholic schools. No one claimed that the public school was of poor quality or that it was failing to do its job, which in 1914 was to inculcate values more traditionally associated with the Protestant communions than with the Catholic Church's teachings in a number of areas – remember that the Northwest Ordinance required the teaching of religion in every public school. As a matter of fact, though, in 1914 the Church urged all parents to avail themselves of whatever school fit their own cultural and traditional needs.

The Church in 1914 militated for excellence in any school because it knew that many families had never been exposed to a sound education and should be; and that a good education was the backbone of a wholesome public discourse and a thriving culture. So in brief, the answer to that question might have been: Our attitude is that the public schools are ours, they are supported as much by Catholics as by anyone else paying their taxes, so we want them to be superior in every way; however for the sake of our faith, we also want our own schools where we can offer the very best in the religious teachings of our faith so that our children can make those beliefs of love, hope and faith part and parcel of their lives so they become fully participating members of a compassionate nation. Today, with the cost of education beyond the means of many families, the Church still hopes to offer the alternative of Catholic schools but continues each of us to assist in making all public schools to be of the highest quality. The Church doesn't think a good education is a benefit only for her own, so urges Catholic parents to take an interest in and support those public schools where they live and work. After all, they are our schools.

### **The Celebration of Sacraments**

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
