Dear People of God,

Last week, while meandering though the Question Box of the Diocesan Mission for non-Catholics I was addressing indulgences and purgatory. The questioner wanted to know about Plenary Indulgences. Some of us a little older may remember our Sunday Missals and the back end which included a lot of prayers and devotionals all of which included a footnote about partial or plenary indulgences, often adding a line like forty quarantines and fifty days, or some such. To understand what's coming below, we have to keep in mind that we humans are inexorably linked to the clock, to time and periodicity. We think in terms of time, be it hours, days, months, years, epochs or eons. Even galactic distances are measured in time: the light year. you're curious about why that is, ask me about a chance to read The Human as Thinker, the chapter of my doctoral work on what it requires to be fully human. It's pretty technical since it's part of a psychological study aimed at understanding the dynamic of being human in the first place, but to shorten the chapter, time is an expedient of experience and allows us to access memory and make use of it to abstract into the future, making humans the only living thing with an identifiable past, present and future. At any rate, given that we think in terms of time, partial indulgence, or a smaller something beyond the ordinary done as a really big favor for somebody by God, is often related to a fixed period of time despite there being no time in the life yet to come!

A plenary indulgence, then is merely asking God to undertake an indulgence - something beyond the ordinary – which completely repairs any hurts left behind by the sins of someone now beyond this life who can no longer make those repairs. As for purgatory, I hope you know that it's not a place, but a transitory condition of purifying ourselves for the perfection of heaven. It's the agony of having to let go of what we possess, like, enjoy, hold, pack away, hide or otherwise don't want to lose because heaven, at least now, is not a place where we can have things, but a condition in which the soul is melded into the reality of God's presence. God hasn't provided a material place for heaven since the soul doesn't need a place. The place called heaven will come about at the end of everything when God raises our bodies and then we need a place because I for one would sink right through a cloud, especially if I was hanging on to a heavy harp, and the thought of falling forever isn't all that enticing! Because we humans think in terms of time, purgatory has traditionally been seen as a place where we spend time. That means a lot of what we have to say about it, or think about it, is locked into this world, not the world yet to come. To fully appreciate purgatory we need to get ourselves out of time and into the timelessness of a loving God more than willing to indulge in some pretty big favors for his beloved people!

The Celebration of Sacraments

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
