

Dear People of God,

Events this past year have focused the attention of the world on racial relations here in the United States. *Ferguson, Baltimore, Cleveland* – cities which resonate not only in the headlines we all read, but in concern across the globe for the loss of values this nation so boldly held out for the downtrodden and oppressed. While the root causes of racism are often laid on the shoulders of eighteenth century slavery, let's be quite honest and admit that there are few people alive today who own[ed] slaves or were enslaved in the sense of being considered property. On the other hand, Pope Francis has been pointing out some modern forms of slavery which are prevalent right here in the good old US of A. Not least of these is the slavery of children exposed to ruinous situations at home where other forms of slavery, including poverty, drugs, alcohol and violence, trap them in a condition not so dissimilar from the eighteenth century version. Certainly, we should all be aware of the slavery of the spirit which daily leads thousands of men, women and children into a contemporary version of the underground railroad as they do their best to escape repressive regimes in Central and South America, or its water-borne version across the Mediterranean. Many others are enslaved to conditions of employment which fail to meet the basic needs of human dignity while the employer, like the plantation owner of old, reaps untold wealth.

Others enslave themselves to economic hardship in order to maintain costly habits involving drugs, alcohol, gambling and other similar pursuits. Young people all too often enslave themselves to a future laden with failure by dropping out of school and even of society itself, turning to lawlessness or homelessness. Many become the property of the State in jails, prisons and reformatories. While many of these species of slavery might not come knocking on our front door, all of us should be aware of them and do our best to eradicate the root causes because, to paraphrase Ben Franklin, "if we don't all hang together we'll certainly all hang separately." That's the case because those root causes tend to be the weeds in society and as I hope everyone knows, weeds tend to take over the garden unless a lot of care is taken to remove them while preserving the fruits, vegetables and flowers! Racism isn't just a black and white issue. It's multifaceted and has as many faces as there are peoples painted by their creator in a wealth of colors, tones and hues. Our work as The Historic Church of St. Patrick and Immaculate Conception is to recognize the art work of the creator and make all welcome!

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

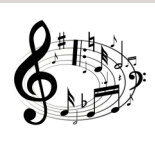

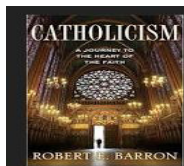
