Dear People of God,

I was asked not too long ago about the role Judas played in the crucifixion and death of Jesus. As we're getting close to those readings in the texts at Mass, let me share a little about the place of Judas in the four gospels. First, like any of the Apostles, there's not much to find and second, this has led to a lot of speculation, almost since the day Judas betrayed Jesus. We know very little about the historical Judas. According to John's gospel, he was the treasurer for the school of disciples Jesus had gathered around himself and John says he was accustomed to stealing from the money bag. Matthew states that Judas was paid 30 pieces of silver for providing the Temple with a time and place where Jesus could be arrested. Matthew begins the story by writing that Judas went to the temple and asked for a bribe to give them Jesus. Apparently, Judas was there when Jesus instituted the Eucharist and shared both bread and wine. He's next seen leading the Temple police to Gethsemane where he betrays Jesus with a kiss. When he sees that his betrayal has led to a death sentence he is filled with remorse, accuses himself of being a sinner, returns the money and hangs himself. Mark begins by writing that Judas went to the temple and says he'll betray Jesus for which the leaders say they will gladly pay a premium. Mark states that all twelve were at the Last Supper. Judas is next seen leading a crowd. He betrays Jesus with a kiss. Nothing more is said about Judas in this gospel. Luke begins by stating that the devil got into Judas and led him to the temple where he plots with the leaders to turn Jesus in. As in the previous two gospels, all twelve are present for the Last Supper.

Judas leads the mob to Jesus but does not get to betray him as Jesus prevents this. There is no further mention of Judas in the gospel, but Luke does mention in the second volume (Acts) that Judas had "acted as a guide" for those who seized Jesus and used his 30 pieces of silver to buy a field where he fell forward and died. The gospel of John begins with the devil putting the idea of betrayal in Judas' mind. Jesus then takes all twelve to the room where the Eucharist will be instituted and says that somebody is going to betray him. Judas and Jesus have a brief conversation and Jesus tells him to leave and 'do quickly what you have to do'. We next encounter Judas at the head of a crowd of soldiers and police but Judas does not give Jesus the kiss of betrayal. And there you have it. What does the Church have to say about all of this? Officially, only that Judas betrayed Jesus. In part that's because there's nothing more to say. Since sin and repentance are in the conscience, the church has never formally condemned Judas - that's for the sinner and God to sort out. Why all the confusion? Essentially, Judas' part is explained fully, or as fully as the gospel writers felt necessary. They weren't concerned with what happens to Judas but focus on what happens to Jesus because he was betrayed. In a sense, Judas becomes Everyman – you and me and everyone else who betrays Jesus by betraying our faith.

The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
