Dear People of God,

Somebody asked me why the Church took down that poster for _____ I put up over on the corner and doesn't get out there and endorse some candidate worth being President. The answer to that is simple: The Church can't. The Catholic Church in the United States is considered a 501-not-for-profit organization, and Internal Revenue regulations prohibit any such organization from naming names or endorsing particular candidates. As you may know from the on-going fuss over the IRS targeting not for profit applications from groups which espouse certain political theories or issues, 501 organizations can take a stand on issues and the church doesn't hesitate to do that. Yes, but why do candidates show up at all those little churches and get an endorsement, the questioner goes on. Well, the answer to that has to do with size and the scope of the IRS's reach in prosecuting violations which would mean losing the 501 status. The Church's 501-not-for-profit 'license' is via the USCCB and includes all of the parishes, dioceses and what not named by the Bishop's Conference in the Kennedy Directory, also known as the National Catholic Directory. If the IRS wanted to stop little churches from doing personal endorsements it would require hundreds of lawyers litigating hundreds of individual cases.

On the other hand, if the church were to endorse a candidate, one lawyer could attack the one 501-not-for-profit ruling of the Church and everybody, all the dioceses, all the parishes, all the special ministries of the Church in the United States would suddenly lose their tax exempt status. Whether we ought to have that status is a different question, but having it saves the people who support the Church (I hope that includes you) billions of dollars every year in federal taxes and opens the door to the states taking away tax exemptions as well. So, you may see a list of all the candidates giving the pros and cons each holds with regard to issues of concern to the church but you won't ever see a single endorsement. The Church certainly wants you to know which candidate represents the values held dear by the Church but can't tell you to go vote for any particular person. Politicians know all of this so they don't come to the church seeking an endorsement, either. By the way, all of this explains why no candidate's posters or billboards can be on Church property. With both Immaculate and Historic on busy corners, that means doing a regular patrol to take down the signs people may put up.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


